In-school presentations tailored to each high school's needs, including a Financial Aid Night.



Grade-specific print and electronic publications offering postsecondary planning resources, tips, and timelines.

LEAF also provides FAFSA filing assistance to Lakeland Community College students and extends its advisory services and virtual programming to the community-at-large.

In preparation of the 2024-25 FAFSA Simplification Act implementation, a major overhaul of Federal Student Aid and the FAFSA, LEAF's advisory team engaged in extensive training to best assist students and families in understanding the many changes in federal aid terminology, processes, and timelines and provide essential guidance for FAFSA 24-25 completion.








2023-24 Income
