LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE (LPN)



JOB DESCRIPTION

Licensed practical nurses (LPNs) care for those with health conditions or impairments under the direction of licensed physicians, dentists, podiatrists, optometrists, or registered nurses. They work in a variety of settings such as doctors' offices, hospitals, outpatient clinics, and nursing homes. Our aging population, along with a rise in chronic diseases, means that more people will need the care that LPNs can provide. Common tasks include:

- Taking vital signs
- Providing basic patient care and comfort including bathing and dressing
- Administering medications (where state law allows)
- Applying dressings and bandages
- Collecting blood and fluid samples
- Observing and recording impact of treatment
- Providing physical and emotional support
- Reporting patients' status and care to registered nurses or physicians

EDUCATION/TRAINING

LPN programs can be between 12-15 months if studying full-time, and 24-30 months if studying part-time. Prospective LPNs must pass the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-PN) after completing their state approved education.

On average, 83 percent of students pass the NCLEX-PN after completing any of the practical nursing programs in Ohio. Choosing an institution that has a high pass rate on this test increases your likelihood of receiving the necessary education to pass it.
