General carpenters provide the foundation for concrete, exteriors, roofs, infrastructure, and scaffolding while also crafting fine trim and finish work. These professionals work with a variety of materials in every kind of structure and bring blueprints to life.

EDUCATION/TRAINING

Carpenters typically learn on the job or through apprenticeships. They often begin doing simple tasks, such as measuring and cutting wood, under the guidance of experienced carpenters or other construction workers. They then progress to more complex tasks, such as reading blueprints and building wooden structures.

RELATED CAREER PATHS



FLOORLAYERS are skilled in the installation of carpeting, hardwood flooring, vinyl composition tile, and sheet goods products made of vinyl, linoleum, and rubber. Their work includes installing decorative floor coverings in commercial buildings, hardwood flooring, and carpeting.

PAY: \$52,000 median annual wage (\$25.00/hour) in May 2024

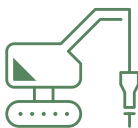
JOB OUTLOOK: 6% (faster than average) from 2024 to 2034



MILLWRIGHTS install, maintain, diagnose, and repair equipment such as compressors, pumps, conveyors, generators, escalators, electric, gas, and steam turbines, monorails, and extruders. UBC millwrights perform critical work at coal, gas, nuclear, and alternative-energy power plants. Their skills are used in industries like automotive, aerospace, food processing, and pharmaceuticals. Daily responsibilities include studying/interpreting blueprints, drilling, welding, and bolting.

PAY: \$65,1700 median annual wage (\$31.33/hour) in May 2024

JOB OUTLOOK: 13% (much faster than average) from 2024 to 2034



PILE DRIVERS drive steel, concrete, or wood piling into the earth during the early stages of construction. Responsibilities may include:

- Pre-installation inspections of the material and job site using static and dynamic testing
- Determining load-carrying capacities
- Gauging hammer performance
- Accommodating lateral, compression, or tension loads
- Responsible for the underwater construction required by many industries, including construction and power generation

PAY: \$70,510 median annual wage (\$33.90/hour) in May 2024

APPRENTICESHIPS

OHIO CARPENTER'S JOINT APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING PROGRAM

(Northeast Ohio Carpenters' Training Center in Richfield, OH)

A four-year program with more than 2,400 apprentices enrolled at this location. Apprentices receive hands-on instruction. The Richfield Campus has individual shops for: Commercial Carpenter, Residential Carpenter, Millwright, Pile Driver, Floorlayer, and Cabinetmaker, as well as classrooms and a state-of-the-art technology learning center. Program benefits include:

- All apprenticeship classes, training, and associate degree college credit earned during the program are provided at no cost to the student
- Earnings range from \$29–35/hour during the apprenticeship program
- Receive union benefits of health insurance and pension after 90 days in the program
- Receive on-the-job training with experienced journeymen
- Learn from experienced instructors
- Pursue a college degree during the apprenticeship program
- Receive certifications

Students must be currently working in a registered apprenticeship program in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training. The four-year apprenticeship program prepares the student to earn a journey-level status in Carpentry, as well as earn an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Applied Industrial Technology.
