

JOB DESCRIPTION

Physical Therapy Assistants (PTAs) work under the direction of a physical therapist. They:

- Help patients do specific exercises and functional activity training to improve their mobility and movement
- Treat patients using a range of techniques, such as therapeutic exercise, functional training, or soft tissue massage; PTAs may also provide electrotherapy, ultrasound, and other treatments when included in the plan of care for the patient
- Observe patients before, during, and after therapy, and document it
- Use knowledge of body systems for safe and effective rehabilitation and to promote health; have an interest in anatomy, exercise, and physical fitness
- Perform tests and measures to collect data about patient progress
- Collaborate with members of the healthcare team to improve patient outcomes
- Use devices and equipment effectively to help patients, such as walkers
- Educate patients/family members about what to do after treatment

EDUCATION/TRAINING

All states require physical therapist assistants to have an associate degree from a program accredited by the [Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education](#). Programs typically last about two years and include coursework in anatomy, physiology, and kinesiology. Students also gain hands-on experience during supervised clinical work. Once you graduate with the Associate of Applied Science in Physical Therapist Assisting degree, you are eligible to take the National Physical Therapy Licensure Examination (NPTE) for PTAs, which is required for state licensure.

IMPORTANT SKILLS/ATTRIBUTES

- Compassion. They must have empathy to help their patients who are often in pain.
- Detail-oriented. Physical therapist assistants should be organized, keep accurate records, and follow written and verbal instructions carefully to ensure optimal care.
- Dexterity. Physical therapist assistants should be comfortable using their hands to provide manual therapy and therapeutic exercises.
- Interpersonal skills. Physical therapist assistants spend much of their time interacting with patients, their families, and other healthcare practitioners, and should enjoy working with people.
- Physical stamina. Physical therapist assistants are on their feet and moving as they work with patients. This includes kneeling, stooping, bending, and standing for long periods of time.

Physical Therapy deals specifically with physical disorders of the body and helps to restore weakened muscles and normal movement and decrease pain.



Occupational Therapy focuses on daily activities and interventions to help patients function more easily in their environment.

Associate of Applied Science in Physical Therapist Assistant

Program includes in-depth classroom learning experience and four clinical experiences. The program is 71 credit hours and approximately 20 months long.

Associate of Applied Science degree in Physical Therapist Assisting Technology

Physical Therapist Assisting is considered full-time, and the PTAT technical courses are only offered during the day. PTAT technical courses take two years to complete and must be taken in sequence. Prerequisites must be completed before applying to the program.

Associate of Applied Science degree in Physical Therapist Assistant Technology

The integrated curriculum includes lecture, lecture/lab, seminar, and practicum courses. Major course content is cumulative and taught in four sequential semesters in a two-year cycle.
